Revised formulas are being used by both Glen Canyon NRA and Lake Mead NRA for 2018 and 2019 relative to prior years. At Glen Canyon NRA, Horseshoe Bend counts are now being reported separately. Canyon de Chelly NM also reported using a revised counting protocol in 2018 and 2019.

February Notes: Glen Canyon NRA does not include counts for Horseshoe Bend-park report is zero. Navajo NM reported issues with traffic counters and resulting loss of data. Numerous parks reported altered schedules with some facility closures on multiple days in February due to adverse weather.
