At Glen Canyon NRA, Horseshoe Bend counts are now being reported separately and are included above. Canyon de Chelly NM also reported using a revised counting protocol in 2018 and 2019.

June Notes: June 2019 data for Coronado NM includes two weeks in July. Navajo NM reported issues with traffic counters and resulting loss of data. Tonto NM was closed entirely for 15 days due to the Woodbury Fire with trail closures for an additional five days.
