February Notes: The Lake Mead NRA visitor counts representing the AZ portion for 2021 and 2022 are estimated. In 2022, Canyon de Chelly NM restricted visitor center levels to 50% capacity. Glen Canyon NRA reported that most launch ramps were closed due to the low lake level. Hubbell Trading Post NHS offered limited services. At Petrified Forest NP the Painted Desert Inn opened again to the public after closing in 2020. Coronado NM and Navajo NM both reported issues with traffic counters.
