October Notes: The Lake Mead NRA visitor counts representing the AZ portion are estimated. Due to the federal government shutdown in October 2025 the majority of parks reported impacts ranging from full public closures to limited services. Collection of visitor data was also limited or unavailable at some parks. Grand Canyon NP operations on the North Rim continued to be closed as a result of summer wildfires though two specific viewpoints opened to the public. Inner canyon trails remained closed due to waterline construction and flash flooding concerns.
